




RIYADH

Proximity to Nearby Cities

Riyadh has exceptional accessibility through road and air transport, including a world-class international airport. Land transportation is the preferred mode for cities, especially those within a 5-6 hour drive radius, with several airports connected with KKIA. Riyadh's large population and rapid expansion can sometimes lead to internal congestion issues, but there are many road and public transportation initiatives underway to streamline transportation within the city.

Riyadh visitors reached 15.4 million overnight visits, while both overnight visitors and spend grew by 2% and 0.01% YoY, and remain well above 2019 levels by 95% and 33%.

Riyadh's domestic segment has more than doubled since 2019 in both visits and spend, while inbound witnessed a decrease YoY in visits and spend -3% and -13%, mainly due to a drop in VFR.

In addition to the Diriyah Gate Project and At-Turaif UNESCO World Heritage Site, Riyadh boasts among the largest collections of cultural and historical assets. As the capital city, its assets provide a glimpse into the founding of the Kingdom, while the many villages and towns are decorated with Najdi architecture and artifacts, from when they were major stopping points for pilgrims from the east coming to Makkah.





At-Turaif District

A UNESCO World Heritage Site and the centerpiece for the Diriyah Gate megaproject, At-Turaif is a must-see historic gem with over three-hundred years of history as the first Saudi capital. At-Turaif is poised to be a premier cultural and historical attraction and destination.





The National Museum

The museum offers 8 distinct hall, including halls covering prehistoric periods, pre-Islamic era, and the rich history of KSA. It contains +3,000 antiquities on display. Also featured nearby is **Al Murabba Palace**, the former home and court of King Abdulaziz, founder of modern Saudi Arabia.





Al Masmak Fortress

A vast clay and mud-brick citadel bult in 1865 and witnessed the birth of the Kingdom. The building has since been restored as a museum displaying KSA's rich history and features a vast array of artifacts, photos, and films. The courtyard outside features **Souq Al Zal**, where visitors can find traditional handicrafts, jewelry, and other souvepirs





Ushaiger Heritage Village

Hidden in the heart of Najd, an oasis dotted region 200 km northwest of Riyadh. Ushaiger Heritage Village provides a glimpse of a slow-paced Saudi society. **The Al Salem museum**, established by its residents, boasts a large collection of artifacts to explore the villages rich history.

Riyadh Season

Often launched in Q4 and lasting several months, Riyadh Season is always grand in scale and attracts local and international visitors. In 2024, Riyadh Season attracted +12 million visitors within the first 3 months.





The Boulevard Riyadh City

A premier entertainment, shopping, and lifestyle destination in Riyadh, offering a wide range of attractions including luxury retail outlets, fine dining, theaters, and live performance venues. It is a vibrant hub for both residents and tourists, playing a central role during major events like Riyadh Season. The Boulevard serves as a focal point for entertainment and cultural experiences, attracting millions of visitors annually with its dynamic mix of events, family-friendly activities, and world-class facilities.





Shopping

Home to many of the Kingdom's most visited malls across different segments, upscale, mid-market, and traditional markets. Several large-scale projects (such as Solitaire Mall, The Avenues, and more) are expected to be completed in the coming years and will transform the retail sector in the city. In addition, there is a growing fashion scene as new local designers enter the industry and the Saudi Fashion Week.





Outdoor Recreation & Sports

Riyadh provides visitors with a variety of recreational and sports activities, especially during the winter months. Its desert dunes provide residents and visitors with a wide array of adrenaline-rush activities and desert camping "Kashtah". Edge of the World

Green Riyadh

One of the most ambitious urban forestation projects globally, Green Riyadh aims to use recycled water to develop 541 km² of green space and plant 7.5 million trees. Once complete, it will reduce temperatures & dust, improve air quality, and support and promote efforts to preserve natural areas and biodiversity.





Heat Cave

Located in Al-Jubayl mountain in Wadi Al-Sulay, it is one of the most accessible caves in Riyadh with an entrance about 20 meters wide. Development is ongoing to improve the tourism infrastructure, increase safety, and provide additional services and offerings.





Al Ghat

Al Ghat national park has a rich flora diversity. The park is situated in Al Ghat, in the vicinity of one of the largest and best conserved traditional villages of Saudi Arabia.

Connectivity Air Transport



Riyadh's main airport, the King Khalid International Airport (KKIA), is KSA's second busiest airport in terms of flights and the second highest in terms of passengers served. With the ongoing airport expansion and impact of Riyadh Air, Riyadh is expected to be the busiest KSA airport.



Out of a total 64.8 million arriving passengers, **King Khalid International Airport** accounted for **29% of passengers.**



Out of a total 452 K arriving flights, King Khalid International Airport accounted for 30% of flights.
