The Eastern Province is the largest in Saudi Arabia by land area and a strategically vital region, serving as the Kingdom's primary source of oil reserves. Its proximity to Riyadh and neighboring GCC countries like Kuwait, Bahrain, Qatar, the UAE, and Oman has fostered a well-developed road network and excellent accessibility. The province boasts abundant and diverse cultural, heritage, and natural assets, making it a prominent hub for business tourism and visits to friends and relatives (VFR), while its leisure tourism segment continues to grow.



A population of +5 million and a relatively well-educated workforce, the region holds strong potential for tourism, both in terms of labor availability and market demand. High accessibility by air, land, and sea and home to KSA's 3rd busiest airport, the King Fahd Causeway, and infrastructure. Less than 500 km from several GCC countries (Qatar, UAE, Bahrain, and Kuwait), the region attracts a significant share of its inbound tourism from GCC. Ithra Cultural Center

Built close to where oil was first discovered, the King Abdulaziz Center for World Culture, "Ithra" is a world-class cultural center and museum. Spanning over 80,000 square meters, it includes a library, a theater, a cinema, an ideas lab, and knowledge tower which is a highly visited attraction for families and tourists alike.





Tarout Castle

A trio of towers on top of a hill on an island that are thought to date back to 5,000 B.C. and were once part of a regional stronghold and civilization that ruled one of Arabia's trade routes.





Saudi Film Festival

Launched by the Saudi Arabian Society for Culture and Arts in partnership with the King Abdulaziz Center for World Culture (Ithra), the Saudi Film Festival is a non-profit initiative to support emerging artists and showcase cultural and artistic films.





Heritage Village

Part museum, part restaurant, Dammam's turret-topped Heritage Village gives visitors a glimpse into a simpler life. The five-story building houses a museum, where troves of jewelry, manuscripts, fabrics, and other artifacts are on display, as well as a craft market where Arabic perfumes, incense, baskets and wall hangings are sold.

Entertainment & Recreation

Non-Exhaustive

Entertainment is a pillar of the tourism agenda for the region with high potential to leverage EP's competitive advantages. The province is ramping up its calendar of festivals and events while looking to expand its retail and F&B offerings to attract leisure tourists.





Khobar Waterfront & Dammam Corniche

A family-favorite, the Khobar waterfront has dancing fountains and landscaped gardens across the coast with views of the King Fahd Causeway and historic water tower with several coffee shops and activities. Dammam Corniche is a popular attraction for a stroll with restaurants, cafés, and family-friendly entertainment.





Shopping

With atmospheric shopping experiences such as the Share Al Hob market, Dammam Souk, and a host of modern super-regional shopping centers with dining areas and amusement parks, Dammam and AlKhobar offer a variety of coastal and urban shopping experiences as well.





Musical & Sports Events

Dammam has begun increasing the number of musical and sporting events to attract domestic and inbound tourists. It previously held a Red Bull Air Race and Formula 1 H20 Powerboat race during Yalla Sharqiah Season, and is exploring new entertainment activities & concerts.





SCITECH Museum

Al Khobar's Science and Technology Centre (SCITECH) is home to interactive and immersive exhibits related to space, sea life, life sciences, technology, and more. The museum also features an Observatory with a telescope to explore the stars.

The Eastern Province's pristine beaches along the Arabian Gulf and large desert landscapes make it a key destination for nature-lovers and beachgoers. There are numerous water-based activities and desert camping activities to delight adventure-seekers and those looking for outdoor recreation.





The Empty Quarter

The Empty Quarter, one the largest uninterrupted deserts in the world, sparsely populated and has become an attraction for adventurous travelers. It occupies 25% of KSA's total land mass, where wind formed and shaped their iconic sand dunes and temperatures averaged between 41C to 51C. It is one of the world's most oil-rich regions.





Half Moon Beach

Located near Khobar, Half Moon Beach is a popular area for many people, with its average depth of ~22 feet serving as a great place for beginner scuba divers. Named for its distinctive curved shape resembling a crescent moon, the area features cafes, wateractivities, and resorts.





Ras Tanura Beach

Beautiful white sand beach decorated with palm trees and is popular among tourists and locals providing family-friendly activities, biking, and other recreational activities.





Outdoor Recreational Activities


The Eastern Province has several outdoor recreational activities to take advantage of its coastline and desert landscapes, ranging from water-sports to camping & star-gazing.

Connectivity Air Transport



The King Fahd International Airport (KFIA) is the Kingdom's third most active airport by number of passengers & flights, while Al-Ahsa International Airport remains comparatively a smaller airport. The majority of inbound visitors are from GCC, which mostly come through land travel rather than air.



Out of a total 64.8 million arriving passengers, KFIA accounts for approximately 10% of all passengers.



Out of a total 452 K arriving flights, KFIA accounted for 12% of total flights.
